The following information and resources are for older adults experiencing abuse or those concerned about a senior.

ELDER ABUSE

Elder abuse is defined as any action or inaction by a person(s) in a trusting relationship that jeopardizes the health or well-being of an older adult. It includes denial of an older adult's fundamental rights, and neglect (active or passive) by a caregiver. It can take many forms including: financial, physical, emotional, sexual, and spiritual.

An abuser can be anyone, but most often it is a family member or partner. Abusers can also be friends or caregivers. They are most often close enough to have influence or control over the victim. Abuse includes using name calling, threats, yelling, put-downs, and physical intimidation to control the senior's actions or decisions. It also includes taking money or possessions without permission, and using coercion to have a senior sign documents. In many cases, older adults feel they have to give in or agree to something in order to avoid escalation or to ensure their safety. Sometimes abuse can unintentionally occur due to

caregiver stress. With additional supports for the older adult and the caregiver, some of this stress can be relieved. Victims include both males and females from every income level and culture, as well as people in both good and poor health.

Signs of abuse

Older adults being abused may become withdrawn, depressed, and isolated. They may have financial difficulty, unexplained injuries, anxiety, or difficulty sleeping. They may have changes in hygiene, nutrition, or medication. They may experience diminishing self-esteem.

Some effects of abuse

Abused or neglected older adults have a 200% increased risk of early death. The stress of living in an abusive situation shortens an older person's life by several years on average. Living with abuse and neglect can also significantly increase the person's chances of becoming ill, or may make other health problems worse. Up to 6% of abused older adults become severely depressed.

Overlooking warning signs

Sometimes signs of abuse are mistaken as a part of growing older, or may look like other health conditions. For example: mental confusion, depression, or anxiety resulting from abuse or neglect may look like dementia. People may not realize that sometimes older adults are experiencing frequent falls or have long-term pain because they are being abused or neglected. Ageism can also play a factor in why these warning signs are overlooked. Ageism is a social attitude and a way of looking at older people that stereotypes them.

For example, often in situations of abuse, older people aren't taken seriously because they are viewed as being forgetful and seen as complainers. It is estimated that between 4 and 10 percent of older adults in Canada experience some type of abuse or neglect from someone they trust or rely on (Public Health Agency of Canada, www.publichealth.gc.ca, 2010).

WHAT TO DO WHEN **SOMEONE DIES:** A CHECK LIST

When someone dies there are a number of agencies, businesses, and government departments you may need to contact to let them know the person is deceased. Even if the deceased person was considered to be low income, many of the following resources need to be contacted and informed of the date of death

Who should do the work?

□ Are you the legal representative? Yes if:

- You are named as the executor in the will:
- You are appointed as the administrator of the estate by a court; or
- You are the liquidator for an estate in Québec:

□If you are not a legal representative, the responsibility goes to a surviving family member, in order of priority:

• spouse, child, child's parent, sibling, grandchild, nephew or niece, other relative solely remaining after deceased.

- □ Arrangements must be made with CRA if the deceased was receiving the following benefits: Goods and Services Tax Credit (GSTC); Canada Child Benefit (CCB) for a child; Working Income Tax Benefit (WITB) for a child.
- Arrangements should be made with CRA to transfer benefits.
- ☐ The legal representative or surviving family member has responsibilities under the Income Tax Act, and may need information from the deceased person's tax records. The information can be obtained by providing CRA with a copy of the deceased's death certificate. social insurance number and a complete copy of the will, or another legal document, such as a grant of probate or letters of administration showing that you are the legal representative. The legal representative's address is also needed for all correspondence with the tax service centre.
- You may wish to appoint an authorized representative to deal with the CRA for tax matters on your behalf. You may do so by completing Form T1013, Authorizing or Cancelling a Representative.
- Death outside of Canada contact the Canadian Consulate Office for assistance.

Retirement Pension – You may qualify for a CPP retirement pension if you worked, you have made at least one valid contribution (payment) to the CPP, and you are at least 60 years old. Although the CPP retirement pension was originally intended to start the month after your 65th birthday, you can begin receiving your CPP retirement pension any time after age 60. You do not have to stop working to receive your retirement

pension. Your monthly payment is smaller if you begin receiving it before age 65, and larger if you take it after age 65.

Disability Benefit - The Canada Pension

Plan (CPP) disability benefit is a monthly payment. It is available to people who contributed recently to the CPP while they worked, and then became unable to work at any job on a regular basis because of a disability. The primary purpose is to replace a portion of employment earnings for people who recently paid into the CPP. There are also benefits for children if at least one parent qualifies for the CPP disability benefit.

Survivor Benefits

- Death Benefit: a one-time payment to, or on behalf of, the estate of a deceased CPP contributor.
- Survivor's Pension: a monthly pension paid to the survivor of a deceased CPP contributor.
- Children's Benefits: a monthly benefit for dependent children of a deceased CPP contributor.

Allowance - The Allowance is a monthly benefit for low-income seniors (aged 60 - 64) whose spouse or common-law partner is eligible for, or currently receiving, the Old Age Security (OAS) pension and the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS).

Allowance for the Survivor - The Allowance for the Survivor Program provides a monthly non-taxable benefit to low-income widowed spouses who are not yet eligible for the Old Age Security (OAS) pension.

Pensions from Other Countries

Canada has international social security agreements with a number of countries that offer comparable pension programs. These programs pay benefits when you

retire, or if you become disabled or die. Social security agreements help people receive the benefits to which they are entitled.

- If you are an AISH client and you live in a facility, such as a nursing home, you may be eligible to receive a maximum monthly modified living allowance (Modified AISH) consisting of an accommodation rate plus a maximum personal allowance of \$315.
 The amount you receive will depend on your and your cohabiting partner's income.
- Your assets and your cohabiting partner's assets must not exceed the

limits allowed under the program.

- AISH may also provide a monthly child benefit of \$100 for each dependent child that resides with you.
- Personal benefits may be provided to you for specific, one-time or ongoing expenses over and above the monthly living allowance or modified living allowance.
- As an AISH client, you, your cohabiting partner and dependent children may also receive health benefits including dental, optical, prescription drugs, essential diabetic supplies, emergency ambulance services and exemption from the Alberta Aids to Daily Living co-payment fee.

9 Quick Safety Tips to Manage Your Medications



By Johanna Trimble and Janet Currie

- **Track your meds**. It's up to you or your family to keep track of the drugs you are taking. Your medication list is unlikely to be available to all health professionals online!
- **Keep a list.** For your safety, carry your own UPDATED list and keep one on your fridge. Make sure to include over-the-counter drugs, as well as drugs prescribed by specialists. For a sample medication list, visit: deprescribingnetwork.ca
- Stick to one pharmacy. Try to fill prescriptions from one pharmacy so drug interactions are easily checked. Any pharmacy's list will only show what their pharmacy has dispensed to you and won't include everything you take.
- Don't start a new drug when you're alone. It's rare, but if you have a severe allergic reaction you'll need immediate help. Never take a prescription drug that was prescribed to someone else.
- Check your prescription. When you pick up your prescription order, check both your name and the drug name on the bottle. At times, people who have the same name have received the other person's drug.



- Be aware of side effects and adverse effects. If you have a new symptom after taking a new drug, don't assume it's a "new condition" or "old age". Tell your doctor or pharmacist right away. It could be adverse effects from the drug itself or an interaction with another drug you already take.
- Beware of the prescription cascade. Sometimes new drugs might be prescribed to deal with symptoms caused by a drug you are already taking. This is called the "prescription cascade" a common example is being prescribed a new drug for stomach upset, which may be caused by a drug you are already taking. Ask your doctor to consider whether new symptoms could be the result of the drugs and whether you should consider stopping a medication or reducing the dose.
- Look out for changes. Tell your doctor how new drugs affect you and whether there's been a change for better or worse. If you SEE something (or feel something), SAY something (just like at the airport!).
- Seniors are more sensitive to medications. Due to age-related changes in liver and kidney function, drugs should sometimes be prescribed to seniors at a reduced dose. Adverse drug reactions can start even if you have been taking a drug for a long time. Your doctor depends on you to raise issues of concern.

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





To qualify, you must:

- be 65 years of age or older
- live in Alberta for at least three months before applying
- be a Canadian citizen, or admitted to Canada for permanent residence (landed immigrant)
- have an income within the program's thresholds. The amount of dental and optical coverage provided is based on your annual income. In general, single seniors with an annual income of \$31,675 or less, and senior couples with a combined annual income of \$63,350 or less, may qualify for the Dental and Optical Assistance for Seniors programs.

Basic Dental

- Includes: checkups, cleanings, fillings, extractions, root canals and basic dentures
- The Dental Assistance for Seniors program provides basic dental coverage to a maximum of \$5,000 every five years.

Basic Optical

- Includes: only prescription eyeglasses, including lenses and frames dispensed by a recognized optical provider.
- The Optical Assistance for Seniors program provides assistance up to \$230 towards the purchase of prescription eyeglasses every three years.





Housing Options Continuing Care System

In Alberta, there are three streams within the continuing care system which can provide seniors with a broad range of health and personal care, accommodation and hospitality services:

- Home living
- Supportive living
- □ Facility living

Home Living is for people who live in their own homes, in single family dwellings, apartments, condominiums, and other seniors' independent living options. In home living, individuals are responsible for and capable of arranging any care and support services that they may need. They can access publicly funded home care services through Alberta Health Services Home Care Program. Home care can provide in-home professional support services such as nursing and rehabilitation, and personal support services like homemaking, bathing or arooming assistance. The home care program is governed by the Public Health Act's Co-ordinated Home Care Program Regulation. Alternatively, individuals can purchase personal and other support services privately.

Supportive Living provides

accommodation in a congregate homelike setting, where people can remain as independent as possible while they have access to accommodation and services that meet their changing needs. Supportive living combines accommodation or housing with hospitality services and other supports and care. It meets the needs of a wide range of people, but not those with highly complex and serious health care needs. Supportive living includes many different types of settings, such as (but not limited to) seniors lodges, family care homes, personal care homes, mental health and designated supportive living accommodations. The settings can be operated by private for-profit, private notfor-profit or public operators. In addition to providing a place to live, services in supportive living accommodations may include meals, housekeeping and social activities. Supportive living

residents may also receive professional and personal support services through the Alberta Health Services Home Care Program. Supportive living is typically unable to serve individuals who exhibit unpredictable behaviours that put themselves and/or others at risk.

Compared with home living, supportive living provides:

- Basic hospitality services such as meals (at least one main meal per day), housekeeping, laundry, and life enrichment services on site and arranged by the housing operator.
- A common area for meals, social functions, etc.
- A safe and accessible environment.

Supportive Living is governed by the Supportive Living Accommodation Licensing Act.

Designated Supportive Living (DSL3, DSL4, **DSL4-D)** is a supportive living setting for individuals who may require 24-hour personal care support, occasional and scheduled professional care, are no longer able to live at home and who would benefit from being in a group setting. Designated Supportive Living 4 Dementia (DSL4-D) provides residents living with dementia a home-like design with small groupings of private bedrooms and associated spaces in a secured therapeutic environment. This environment provides 24-hour on site scheduled and unscheduled professional health and personal care and support provided by LPNs and HCAs. Designated Supportive Living residents pay a monthly accommodation charge to cover the costs of providing accommodations and services like meals, housekeeping and building maintenance. Health services in designated supportive living are publicly funded and provided through Alberta

Health Services. More information on having your care needs assessed within Greater Edmonton and moving into a designated supportive living facility is available by contacting Alberta Health Services at 780.496.1300.




Facility Living/Long-term Care iCare is designed to meet the needs of people with the highest and most complex needs who are unable to remain at home or in a supportive living setting. Long-term care settings provide both accommodation and health services in facilities such as nursing homes and auxiliary hospitals and have specialized physical design and infrastructure to address highly complex needs. Long-term care residents with medical conditions that may be serious, chronic and/or unpredictable and require access to registered nursing services on a 24-hour basis. These professionals are able to respond to the need for unscheduled assessments and prescribe interventions.

Residents pay an accommodation charge to cover the costs of providing accommodations and accommodation related services like meals, housekeeping and building maintenance. Health services in long-term care are publicly funded and provided through Alberta Health Services. More information on having your care needs assessed within Greater Edmonton and moving into a long-term care facility is available by contacting Alberta Health Services at 780.496.1300.

Facility living/long-term care is governed by the Nursing Homes Act or the Hospitals Act.

HOME LIVING

SENIORS' SELF-CONTAINED HOUSING PROGRAM

Government of Alberta

This program provides apartment type accommodation to low and moderate income seniors who are functionally independent with or without the assistance of existing community based services. All suites are equipped with a refrigerator and stove.

Tenant Eligibility and Selection Criteria

Seniors whose income falls below local limits (2017 Core Need Income Thresholds: maximum annual income: \$42,000 sinale. \$53,000 couple (reviewed every July 1st)), who meet citizenship requirements and who are functionally independent, with or without the help of existing community based services, are eligible. Seniors are defined as persons 65 years of age or older. Seniors can also be defined as someone less than 65 years of age with special circumstances. Eligible applicants are prioritized on the basis of need according to a legislated point scoring system. Criteria used to determine an applicant's current situation and level of need includes factors such as percent of income paid to rent, emergency situations, utility responsibilities and accessibility issues.

Rental Rates

A tenant's rent, which includes heat, water and sewer expenses, is based on 30 percent of a household's adjusted income. The tenant is responsible for electricity, telephone and cable television, as well as any additional services they may request (e.g. parking).

Housing Delivery

Local Housing Management Bodies (HMBs) located throughout the province operate and administer the program on behalf of the Government of Alberta. Program elements delegated to individual HMBs include tenant selection, rent calculation, building maintenance and conflict resolution. HMBs may have local residency requirements.

HOME LIVING:

Alberta Health Services

Professional and support services are provided to clients who live in their own residences to assist them to remain independent in their homes. Clients may live in a house, apartment, duplex, townhouse, condominium or any other independent living option.

Services may also be provided in community clinic settings. Examples of care provided at clinics includes wound care, catheter care, lower leg assessment, and intravenous therapy. Home Living provides care for clients at all ages and stages of life:

- •Short-term care for those who need minimal assistance for a short time
- •Long-term care for the chronically ill and those requiring assistance to maintain health and independence.
- Palliative home care staff provide support for those at the end of life
- Children's services support children with health care needs and their families Home Living services include:
- Home Care Adult Services
- Home Care Children's Services
- Home Care Volunteer Services
- Palliative Home Care
- Comprehensive Home Option for Integrated Care of the Elderly (CHOICE)
- Day Programs

- Community Aids to Independent Living (CAIL)
- Geriatric Consult Team
- Stroke Early Support Discharge Day Programs provide medical, rehabilitation and/or social programs.

Most day programs support medical and rehabilitation needs and some programs support people with early Alzheimer disease or dementia. CHOICE - the Comprehensive Home Option for Integrated Care of the Elderly is an umbrella program that provides a full range of medical, social and supportive services for seniors at high risk of institutionalization. Transportation, emergency response, assessments for home adaptation and personal care are provided through CHOICE. Assessment and admission to CHOICE are arranged through Community Care Access at 780.496.1300.

HOME LIVING - HOUSING COOPERATIVES

Co-ops come in many different shapes and sizes, ranging from collections of townhouses and small buildings with 4-12 units to large apartment-style buildings with hundreds of units.

What sets co-ops apart from private rental housing is that they are democratic communities where the residents make decisions on how the co-op operates. Housing co-ops are member-owned and controlled organizations. The monthly housing charges are set by the members to cover the costs of running the co-op. Members elect the board of directors. approve the annual budget and set policy. Member's right to live in the co-op is protected. A member can live in a co-op for as long as he or she wishes, as long as he or she follows the rules (bylaws) of the co-op, and pays his or her housing charge (rent) on time.

Housing co-ops can also be strong communities, where members actively participate in the business of the co-op. In addition to standard tasks, such as approving the annual budget, members often volunteer with maintenance tasks (e.g. lawn care) and are involved in other community-based projects, such as producing a co-op newsletter. Some co-ops work together to coordinate health and home supports for residents with specialized health care needs.

HOME LIVING - LIFE LEASE

While financial requirements of the life lease depend on the particular development, residents typically invest in their apartment on a "life lease", allowing them to live in their own suite for as long as they choose. The requirement is usually a deposit of 35%-100% of the suite value before moving in. All residents pay a monthly fee to cover operating costs, such as property taxes, utilities, and maintenance of common areas. When less than the full value of the suite has been deposited, there is a monthly rental charge to finance the unpaid balance. In one example, a suite valued at \$400,000 with 50% deposited (\$200,000), the monthly rent was reduced from \$2,560 with 0% deposit, to a total monthly cost of \$550. This fee includes property taxes, utilities, maintenance of the common area, and in the suite, and property management. Additional services that may be available for an additional cost include a range of supportive living services, including meals, housekeeping, and recreation programs. Some developments offer long-term care facility living, which are accessed through Alberta Health Services - Community Care Access (see page 263).

Should you decide to move out, or in the event of your death, the amount of your original investment is refunded or returned to your estate. No interest is paid on the initial investment. Depending on the particular life lease development, there is a deduction from 1% to 12% from the initial investment to cover re-sale and administrative costs.

When purchasing a life lease suite, the agreement should be reviewed by an accountant or lawyer for the same reasons that a professional would advise on a real estate purchase.

HOME LIVING - CONDOMINIUMS

Buying a Condominium

Buying a condominium means buying a piece of property individually, as well as sharing property ownership with other owners in the same condominium complex. Buying a condominium involves living within the boundaries of the community and the bylaws adopted by that community. The Condominium Property Act and the Condominium Property Regulations set out the rules for operating and managing condominiums in Alberta. The legislation includes:

- the rights of a unit owner
- the powers and duties of a condominium corporation
- the responsibilities of a condominium corporation and of a unit owner
- rules regarding budgets and financial matters of the condominium corporation
- rules regarding bylaws, including how they can be changed and enforced
- rules about reserve funds
- responsibilities regarding management agreements, renting a condominium unit, and proper insurance coverage
- requirements for annual general meetings of the unit owners and meetings of the condominium board.

SUPPORTIVE LIVING

What is supportive living?

Supportive living provides accommodation in a congregate homelike setting, where people can remain as independent as possible while they have access to accommodation and services that meet their changing needs. Supportive living combines accommodation or housing with hospitality services and other supports and care. It meets the needs of a wide range of people, but not those with highly complex and serious health care needs. Supportive living includes many different types of settings, such as (but not limited to) seniors lodges, group homes, mental health and designated supportive living accommodations. The settings can be operated by private for-profit, private notfor-profit, or public operators. In addition to providing a place to live, services in supportive living accommodations may include meals, housekeeping, and social activities. Supportive living residents may also receive professional and personal support services through home care. Supportive Living residents pay a monthly accommodation charge to cover the costs of providing accommodations and services like meals, housekeeping, and building maintenance. Supportive living is also typically unable to serve individuals who exhibit unpredictable behaviours that put themselves and/or others at risk.

SUPPORTIVE LIVING - SENIORS LODGES

Seniors lodges typically offer single and double bed/sitting rooms, meals, housekeeping and other services, and recreational opportunities for seniors who are functionally independent, with or without the help of existing community-based services. Seniors Lodges may be operated by private for-profit or nonprofit organizations, however the majority of lodges are managed by a housing management body through the Seniors' Lodge Program administered by Alberta Seniors and Housing.

In the **Seniors' Lodge Program**, applicants are prioritized on the basis of need, taking into consideration housing needs, level of support required and the applicant's income. In some cases, applicants must also meet local residency requirements. Lodge rates are set by the local housing management body, so they may vary between regions. To protect lower income residents, operators must adjust the monthly rate to ensure that each resident has at least \$315 per month in disposable income. DESIGNATED SUPPORTIVE LIVING SITES

Designated Supportive Living (DSL) is administered by Alberta Health Services. The term "designated" refers to spaces within a supportive living facility where Alberta Health Services controls access to a specific number of spaces according to an agreement between Alberta Health Services and the operator.

An assessment by Alberta Health
Services is required to access designated
supportive living. Referral for assessment
within Greater Edmonton is made for
all designated supportive living facilities
through Community Care Access at
780.496.1300. You can access this
program if you live in Alberta, have an
Alberta Health Care Number or have
applied for and are eligible to receive
Alberta Health Care coverage.

Designated Supportive Living Accommodation Charges:

Residents are responsible for the cost of accommodation or rent in designated supportive living, as well as for any additional care or support services requested by the resident that are not part of the care plan completed by the Alberta Health Services Case Manager. Please note that the maximum accommodation charges in long-term care and designated supportive living increases annually on July 1 based on the Alberta Consumer Price Index

(CPI). For the most current maximum accommodation charges, please go to http://www.health.alberta.ca/services/continuing-care-accommodation-charges.html.

The Province provides financial assistance to eligible low-income residents in Long Term Care or in Designated Supportive Living through the Alberta Seniors Benefit program. FACILITY LIVING

Long-Term Care Facilities

(e.g. nursing homes and auxiliary hospitals) are specifically for individuals with complex, unpredictable medical needs, who require 24 hour on-site Registered Nurse assessment and/or treatment. For a small number of seniors who can no longer be supported in their own home, or in a supportive living facility, long-term care might be an appropriate living option. You may need long-term care for:

- Complex end of life care needs
- Complex medication management
- Complex nursing care
- Inconsistent or unstable behavior that places you, or others, at risk

An assessment by Alberta Health Services is required to access long-term care. Referral for assessment within Greater Edmonton is made for all long-term care facilities through Community Care Access at 780.496.1300.

Long-Term Care Accommodation Charges:

Residents are responsible for the cost of accommodation or rent in long-term care, as well as for any additional care or support services requested by the resident that are not part of the care plan completed by the Alberta Health Services Case Manager. Please note that the maximum accommodation charges in long-term care and designated supportive living increases annually on July 1 based on the Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI). LEGAL INFORMATION ON PERSONAL DECISION MAKING

There are a variety of options for decision-making, which can range from advanced planning to full legal guardianship. Below is a description of the various options.

1. Options for Advance Planning

Personal Directive: a legal document that allows you to name an individual you trust to make personal* decisions on your behalf, in the event you are unable to do so yourself.

Enduring Power of Attorney: a legal document that allows you to name an individual you trust to make financial decisions on your behalf, either immediately, or in the event you are unable to make these decisions yourself.

Supported Decision-Making: allows you to name an individual to obtain personal information on your behalf that may help you in making personal* decisions.

Will: a legal document where you provide

a statement about how to divide your property (also known as 'estate') after death. A will must be in writing, and does not take effect until you die.

2. Options for when an adult does not have mental capacity** and advance planning options are not in place.

Specific Decision-Making: when an adult does not have the mental capacity** to make a personal decision* and they do not have a guardian or Personal Directive, a health care provider (physician, nurse practitioner, or dentist for dental care only), may choose a relative to act as a specific decision maker and make the necessary decision on behalf of the adult.



Co-Decision Making: allows an individual, assessed as significantly mentally impaired, to consent to a court order appointing a trusted person or persons as his or her co-decision maker. The order requires the adult to make personal decisions* with his or her co-decision maker.**

Guardianship: a guardian appointed by the court has the legal responsibility to make decisions for an adult who lacks the capacity to make specific personal decisions and does not have a Personal Directive. Usually a family member or friend acts as a 'private' guardian. If no one is able, willing, or suitable, the Public Guardian may act as the adult's guardian.**

Trusteeship: a trustee, appointed by the Court, has the legal responsibility to make financial decisions for an adult who lacks the capacity to make financial decisions and does not have an Enduring Power of Attorney. Usually a family member or friend acts as 'private' trustee. If no one is able, willing, or suitable, the Public Trustee may act as trustee.**

Informal Trusteeship: arrangements that allow an individual to have authority to assist with financial decisions for an adult who lacks that capacity, or where the adult has minimal assets and needs help managing a government cheque. These arrangements are made with the government department issuing the cheque such as AISH, OAS, Veterans Affairs, etc.

* Personal decisions include: health matters, living arrangements (where and with whom), associations, participation in social activities, educational activities, employment, and legal matters (not of a financial nature).

**The type of court application is based on recommendations made in a Capacity Assessment Report. Capacity is determined by a physician, psychologist, or trained capacity assessor.

A lawyer's principal responsibility is to ensure each client obtains the benefit of his or her legal rights and is aware of his or her legal obligations. In approaching this duty, lawvers have three fundamental obligations: they must serve clients competently, be completely loval to clients, and keep client communications confidential. The services lawyers can provide include: answering legal questions, helping clients find an answer, appearing in court on a client's behalf, mediatina disputes, counselling clients, planning estates, administering wills, drafting contracts, writing letters and opinions, taking steps to avoid litigation, negotiating settlements, and providing advice about clients' legal problems.

Simplified Renewal Application Process

If you are eligible to use the Simplified Renewal Application Process, you need only provide a completed simplified renewal passport application (PPTC 054), along with your current Canadian passport, the required fee and two recent photos*.

The Simplified Renewal Application Process does not require supplementary identification or guarantor information.

To be eligible for Simplified Renewal, your current Canadian passport must:

- be submitted;
- be valid or expired for no more than one year;
- have been issued based upon an adult application form. (16 years of age or older at the time of your previous application);
- be in the exact same name, sex, date of birth and place of birth as requested on your new simplified

renewal application form;

- have been issued for five (5) or ten (10) years;
- not be damaged;
- never have been reported lost or stolen. With the Simplified Renewal Application Process, you can apply in person in Canada at any Passport Canada office or Service Canada receiving agent location, or by mail in Canada or from the United States, or in person at a Government of Canada passport issuing office abroad. Check passport processing times at: Canada.ca/passport.

*The new photos are only valid for 6 months from date they were taken. They do not need to be signed by anyone (guarantor). However, the name and address of the photographer or studio, as well as the date the photos were taken, must be provided on the back of one photo. Refer to the photo requirements at: www.canada.ca/passport

Adults (16 years of age or over) have the option of a 5-year or 10-year passport.

FRAUDS AND SCAMS

Every day, seniors are at risk of being taken advantage of by criminals. Although many legitimate businesses market their products and services over the telephone (telemarketing), doorto-door, or through the Internet, mail, newspaper and magazine ads, there are some dishonest people who will use these methods to try to take your money. Learn how to tell the difference between a legitimate and honest offer and individuals who could be defrauding you.

Scammers Do Not Discriminate

Scammers target people of all backgrounds, ages and income levels. Fake lotteries, Internet frauds, get-richquick schemes, and miracle health cures are some of the favoured means of separating the unwary from their money. New varieties of these scams appear all the time. Some popular scams include:

Lotteries, Sweepstakes, and Contests

You cannot win money or a prize in a lottery unless you have entered it yourself, or someone else has entered it on your behalf. You cannot be chosen as a random winner if you did not submit an entry.

Money Transfer Requests

Be very careful when someone offers you money to help transfer their funds. Once you send money to someone, it can be very difficult, if not impossible, to get it back, and you also risk having your identity stolen.

Internet Scams

Don't just assume an email you receive is legitimate. If the email is asking you to visit a website to "update", "validate" or "confirm" your account information, be sceptical.

Handy Hints to Protect Yourself

Protect Your Identity

- Only give out your personal details and information where it is absolutely necessary and when you trust the person you are speaking to or dealing with.
- Destroy personal information: don't just throw it out.

Money Matters

- Never send money to anyone you don't know and trust.
- Do not send any money or pay any fee to claim a prize or lottery winnings.

The Face-to-Face Approach

• If someone comes to your door, ask to see some identification. You do not have to let them in, and they must leave if you ask them to.

Telephone Business

 Do not give out your personal, credit card or online account details over the phone unless you made the call and the phone number came from a trusted source.

Email Offers

- Never reply to a spam email the best course of action is to delete any suspicious emails without opening them.
- Legitimate banks and financial institutions will never ask you for your account details in an email or ask you to click on a link in an email to access your account.

Internet Business

- Install software that protects your computer from viruses and unwanted programs and make sure it is kept current. If you are unsure, seek the help of a computer professional.
- Never enter your personal, credit card or online account information on a website that you are not sure is genuine.
- Never send your personal, credit card or online banking details through an email.

Scams and You: What To Do If You Get Scammed!

Report a scam. By reporting the scam to authorities, they may be able to warn other people about the scam and minimize the chances of the scam spreading further. You should also warn your friends and family.

If you think someone has gained access to your online account, telephone banking account or credit card details call your financial institution immediately so they can suspend your account and limit the amount of money you lose. Credit card companies may also be able to perform a "charge back" (reverse the transaction) if they believe that your credit card was billed fraudulently.

If you have sent money to someone that you think may be a scammer:

- If you sent money through an electronic funds transfer (over the Internet), contact your financial institution immediately. If they have not already processed the transfer, they may be able to cancel it.
- If you sent a cheque, contact your financial institution immediately. If the scammer hasn't already cashed your cheque, they may be able to cancel it.
- If you sent money through a wire service (such as Western Union or Money Gram), contact the wire service immediately. If you are very quick, they may be able to stop the transfer.

- The Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC) is a joint forces operation with the RCMP, OPP and the Competition Bureau.
- The CAFC collects information and criminal intelligence on mass marketing fraud, and identity fraud schemes. The CAFC does not investigate but provides valuable assistance to law enforcement agencies all over the world.
- The CAFC Senior Support Unit has senior volunteers that call back senior victims to offer education & support.

The CAFC top mass marketing scams targeting seniors:

Tax scams: Fraudsters are calling impersonating the Canada Revenue Agency claiming that a recent audit has identified discrepancies from past filed taxes. Repayment is required immediately. Fraudsters threaten consumers with jail time and/or deportation. Fraudsters want payment asap. Contact the CRA at 1-800-959-8281 to confirm if you owe back taxes or

are entitled to a refund. The CRA would never request payment by money service business, iTunes aift cards or bitcoin.

Phishing Scams are misleading and deceptive emails, falsely claiming to be from a legitimate organization such as a financial institution, business or government agency in an attempt to have the consumer surrender private and personal information.

These unsolicited phishing scams are designed to get victims to click on malicious links or attachment that result in the installation of malicious software. Watch for spelling and formatting errors. Check the embedded hyperlink in the suspicious email by hovering your mouse over the link to verify the address. Do not click on any attachments; they can contain viruses and spyware. Go with your gut. If an email seems fishy it probably is.

Prize Scams

can may target you by phone, email or social media. They say you are winner of a large lottery or sweepstake. They may claim to represent "Reader's Digest" or "Publisher's Clearing House" and before you get your winnings, you are required to pay a small advance fee to cover taxes or legal fees associated with the win. Never pay fees upfront through a money service business such as Western Union, MoneyGram or by loading funds to prepaid credit cards such as iTunes. Any unsolicited phone call advising that you have won a lottery is fake. No winnings are ever received.

Service Scam

Any false, deceptive or misleading offer of services. These scams typically involve third parties offering anti-virus protection, lower credit card interest rates.

Emergency/Grandparent Scam

A grandparent receives a phone call from a con artist claiming to be a grandchild. They claim being in a car accident, and in trouble with the law and need money. Wanting to help, the victim sends the money as instructed. Variations on the scam exist but predominantly the emergency scam is directed toward the grandparents.

Extortion Scam

Consumers receive a call or text message claiming that they owe "back taxes" as the result of an audit. The payment must be made immediately to avoid a fine. However, the recipient is told that the outstanding warrant can be avoided if the payment is made promptly. In many cases, individuals are told they will be deported if the taxes are not paid right away. Consumers are instructed to purchase and activate iTunes gift cards and provide the codes back to the fraudsters.

Warning sign(s) - How to protect yourself:

- If you are asked to pay for any service or product with CRA or CIC by prepaid cards such an iTunes gift card, don't do it, it's a scam!
- Ask yourself why the CRA would be asking for payment through an iTunes gift card over the phone or text message when they already have you on file as a taxpayer.
- Contact the CRA to confirm that you in fact owe back taxes, or are entitled to a refund, before providing any personal or banking information.

But the scam with the highest financial loss is the:

Romance Scam

Any individual with false romantic intentions towards a victim and by gaining their affection and trust (sometimes with the promise of marriage) gains access to the victim's money, bank account, credit cards or in some cases by getting the victims (usually unknowingly) to commit fraud on their behalf. In 2011, Romance scams emerged as highest grossing scam, with over 12 million in losses reported by Canadians. This scam has also lead to incidents of suicide in cases where victims have lost their life saving and have been emotionally destroyed.

Tips that will help minimize your risk.

- **1.** Before you reveal any personally identifying information, find out how it will be used and if it will be shared.
- **2.** Pay attention to your billing cycles. Follow up with creditors if your bills don't arrive on time.
- 3. Guard your mail. Deposit outgoing mail in post office collection boxes or at your local post office. Promptly remove mail from your mailbox after delivery. Ensure mail is forwarded or re-routed if you move or change your mailing address.
- **4.** Utilize passwords on your credit card, bank and phone accounts. Avoid using easily available information such as your mother's maiden name, your birth date, the last four digits of your SIN or your phone number.
- **5.** Minimize the identification information and number of cards you carry.
- **6.** Do not give out personal information on the phone, through the mail or over the internet unless you have initiated the contact or know whom you're dealing with.
- 7. Keep items with personal information in a safe place. An identity thief will pick through your garbage or recycling bins. Be sure to tear or shred receipts, copies of credit applications, insurance forms, physician statements and credit offers you get in the mail.
- **8.** Give your SIN only when absolutely necessary. Ask to use other types of identifiers when possible.
- **9.** Don't carry your SIN card; leave it in a secure place.

If you suspect or know that you are a victim of identity fraud, or if you unwittingly provided personal information

or financial information: Keep records of steps taken to clear your name and re-establish your credit.

Step 1 - Contact your bank/financial institution and credit card company

Step 2 - Contact the two national credit bureaus. Let them know you are a victim or at risk for ID fraud.

Request a fraud alert be placed on your credit report (Dispute any activity on your report that you did not initiate).

FALSE CHARITIES

In Canada we have a long and honourable tradition of voluntary giving, often through charity organizations. If an unfamiliar charity organization contacts you - by mail, phone, or Internet - be careful. Are they bogus?

Warning signs

- High pressure or threatening.
- Want you to contribute immediately.
- Thanks you for a pledge you didn't make.
- Copycat, misleading, or deceiving names.

What you can do: Ask

- for information to be sent to you in writing.
- how much of your gift will be used directly for the charity.
- how much goes to administrative costs.
- if the charity is registered, get their charitable tax number. Call the Canada Revenue Agency at 1.800.267.2384. Compare numbers.

What else you can do:

- Never give your personal/financial information.
- Call the charity. Do they know of the appeal? Ask them the above questions.
- Remember, on an incoming call a person could be misrepresenting a legitimate charity.
- Once a year, decide which charities you want to donate to and send your cheque directly to their head office. There are more than 85,000 registered charities in Canada. The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) reviews applications for registered status and determines if an organization's purposes and activities are charitable and provide a public benefit. To find out if an organization seeking a donation from you is a registered charity, visit canada.ca/charities-list

INHERITANCE SCHEME

Foreign Money Offer: Any solicitation commonly offering or requesting assistance in the transfer of a large sum of money from an international country. The solicitation may also come from a lawyer or some legal entity advising the victim of an inheritance of a sum of money. The victim must pay one or more advance fees before the money can be released. The money or inheritance is fictitious and the victim never receives the money promised. This is sometimes referred to as Nigerian, 419 or West African fraud.

- Medical reports are required upon renewal of Class 5, 6 and 7 operator's license at age 75, 80 and every two years thereafter. The same report is required for holders of Class 1, 2 and 4 commercial drivers' licenses every five years until age 45, every two years until

- age 65, and then annually after the age of 65.
- The Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan will pay for medical exams for motor vehicle operators who are 74 years and six months of age and over.

What minor and major repairs must you make in the next few years?

Would freeing up the cash in your home allow you to have a more enjoyable lifestyle

Are taxes, insurance, utilities, and other costs affordable for you?




